Topic discussions:

- a. Send letters of invitation to the above.
- b. Author a letter to local newspapers, TV, etc.
- c.Get the ARRL to include an announcement in their publication *QST*magazine. (time limit to get published)

d. Use Facebook to advertise the event. Newspaper readership is down but FB is seen by lots of people.

What to show participants to the Open House:

- a. Have a five minute talk to small groups then move on
- b. Have displays of early CW transmission equipment, early voice transmission, frequency bandplans, VHF / UHF usage, simplex vs. repeater use, digital communications DMR/HF/VHF/UHF. How equipment and technology has changed.

*** OR ***

Have the above communicated by a television display via computer CD. Check with ARRL for possibility of obtaining such materials.

- c. Equipment displays. Club museum? Heathkit, modern, DMR, HT vs. HF vs. PC/HF capabilities. Moon Bounce. Fox hunts.
- d. CW demonstration. See if Randall Hash WB4BBF could be available. Voice demonstrations over the air. Have Hams scheduled to talk to the exhibitor at the Open House.
- e. Show how the VHF/UHF simplex frequencies can contact the 911 Center from different places in Mercer County. Charles Priest KE4OOH had this exercise performed several years ago.
- f. Do we want to include food, drinks, etc.? What kind of each? How to pay for this? Postage costs for mailings. Bulk mail rates?

Matt asks that the membership think about this event and please add or subtract to these ideas. We will discuss this at the next business meeting on April 4, 2022.
